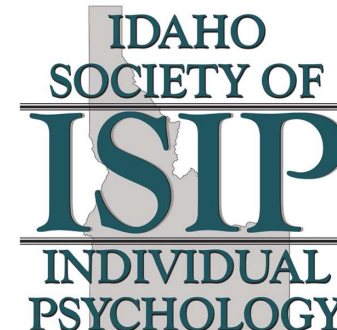

"Simple and Broad: Discovering Adlerian Psychology in All Aspects of Life"

Adlerian Psychology is not a theory confined to the work of counseling and psychotherapy; rather, it is a grand theory of human behavior and flourishing that can be witnessed and applied outside of a clinical setting. This workshop will seek to broaden the range of application of Adlerian theory, as well as demonstrate how this broadening can feed back into clinical work, where simple approaches will be demonstrated with the goal of staying focused on the Life Tasks and Social Interest.
